And so, I want to write, in this piece, as a Catholic theologian to my fellow Catholics. If we Catholics simply assume the secular ideologies of our public discourse and parrot the arguments found in them, we make no meaningful contribution. Instead, we import the political divisions of the culture into the Church, further weakening our identity and witness. If we are to learn the lessons God is offering us all through this tragedy and contribute to the healing of Canadian society, Catholics need to learn to see this issue through theological lenses."
